- **HALT:** STOP ALL MOVEMENT IMMEDIATELY.

BASIC DRILL COMMANDS EXPLAINED

STEP-BY-STEP BREAKDOWN OF BASIC COMMANDS

1. **ATTENTION:** STAND UPRIGHT, HEELS TOGETHER, ARMS AT SIDES, EYES FORWARD.
2. **LEFT FACE:** PIVOT SHARPLY 90 DEGREES TO THE LEFT ON THE LEFT HEEL AND RIGHT TOE.
3. **RIGHT FACE:** PIVOT SHARPLY 90 DEGREES TO THE RIGHT ON THE RIGHT HEEL AND LEFT TOE.
4. **ABOUT FACE:** PIVOT 180 DEGREES TO FACE THE OPPOSITE DIRECTION, USING THE RIGHT HEEL AND LEFT TOE.
5. **PRESENT ARMS:** SALUTE SMARTLY BY BRINGING THE RIGHT HAND SHARPLY TO THE BRIM OF THE HEADGEAR OR EYEBROW.
6. **ORDER ARMS:** RETURN THE HAND TO THE SIDE FROM THE SALUTE POSITION.
7. **FORWARD MARCH:** STEP OFF SMARTLY WITH THE LEFT FOOT, MAINTAINING ALIGNMENT AND RHYTHM.
8. **HALT:** STOP MOVEMENT ON COMMAND, BRINGING BOTH FEET TOGETHER SMARTLY.

CATEGORIES OF DRILL COMMANDS

DRILL COMMANDS ARE CLASSIFIED INTO VARIOUS CATEGORIES, EACH SERVING A SPECIFIC PURPOSE IN THE EXECUTION OF DRILLS. THE DRILL COMMANDS GUIDEBOOK ORGANIZES COMMANDS INTO PREPARATORY COMMANDS, EXECUTION COMMANDS, AND SUPPLEMENTARY COMMANDS. THIS STRUCTURE ENHANCES CLARITY AND EFFICIENCY DURING DRILLS.

TYPES OF DRILL COMMAND CATEGORIES

- **PREPARATORY COMMANDS:** ALERT PARTICIPANTS TO PREPARE FOR A SPECIFIC MOVEMENT (E.G., "RIGHT," "LEFT," "ABOUT").

THIS SECTION PROVIDES ACTIONABLE TIPS TO FOSTER PRECISION AND COHESION DURING DRILL SESSIONS.

TIPS FOR DRILL INSTRUCTORS

- SPEAK CLEARLY AND CONFIDENTLY, PROJECTING YOUR VOICE TO REACH THE ENTIRE GROUP.
- USE CONSISTENT TIMING AND RHYTHM WHEN ISSUING COMMANDS.
- ENSURE COMMANDS ARE CONCISE AND UNAMBIGUOUS.
- OBSERVE PARTICIPANTS AND PROVIDE IMMEDIATE FEEDBACK FOR IMPROVEMENT.
- ENCOURAGE REPETITION AND PRACTICE TO BUILD MUSCLE MEMORY AND CONFIDENCE.

COMMON MISTAKES AND HOW TO AVOID THEM
