The author closely examines various instruments deployed for conveying securities disclosure and dissemination of information, and looks extensively at relevant rulings as enunciated by an Arab court of cassation. He then constructs a model of an

effective securities disclosure regime in order to provide better investor protection for shareholders under Shari'a.
