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john savage reflections: Probleme und Möglichkeiten von Identitätskonstruktionen in Hanif Kureishis "The Buddha of Suburbia" Katrin König, 2001-10-29 Inhaltsangabe: Einleitung: Hanif Kureishi, zeitgenössischer Postcolonial Storyteller, ist Autor von Theaterstücken, Drehbüchern, Romanen, Kurzgeschichten und Essays. *The Buddha of Suburbia*, der 1990 erschienene erste Roman des Autors, ist typisch für Kureishis Werk in seiner Darstellung individueller Identitätsprozesse, wie sie sich unter den spezifischen Lebensbedingungen im London postmoderner und postkolonialer Zeit vollziehen. In diesem Sinne setzt sich die vorliegende Arbeit aus einer sowohl postmodernen wie auch postkolonialen Perspektive exemplarisch mit den Problemen und Möglichkeiten von Identitätskonstruktionen in *The Buddha of Suburbia* auseinander.
