JAMES DEAN WAS BORN ON FEBRUARY 8, 1931, IN MARION, INDIANA. FATAL CAR ACCIDENT

ON SEPTEMBER 30, 1955, JAMES DEAN DIED IN A CAR CRASH WHILE DRIVING HIS PORSCHE 550 SPYDER NEAR CHOLAME, CALIFORNIA. HE WAS ONLY 24 YEARS OLD. THE TRAGEDY SHOCKED THE WORLD AND CONTRIBUTED TO THE MYTHOS SURROUNDING HIS LIFE. DEAN'S DEATH WAS WIDELY COVERED IN THE MEDIA, WITH FANS MOURNING THE LOSS OF A PROMISING AND INFLUENTIAL STAR.

Unimpressed after reading it, Ray began writing his own story. Warner Bros. quickly bought it and hired Ray to direct the film.
