Fu così che nel 1931 nacquero le tre storie d'amore, *La sinfonia di Parigi*, *Natale* e *Carnevale di Nizza*, qui tradotte e pubblicate per la prima volta in Italia, con la speranza che potessero un giorno essere trasposte sul grande schermo. Del resto, per la scrittrice francese l'incontro con il cinema - seppur indirettamente - era già avvenuto con la realizzazione del film *David Golder*, per il quale il regista Julien Duvivier dichiarò di non aver avuto bisogno di aggiungere scene o modificare i dialoghi tratti dal romanzo omonimo, tanto la scrittura della Nemirovsky si armonizzava perfettamente al ritmo e alle tecniche narrative cinematografiche. Nessuna di queste storie diventò mai un film, ponendo così fine alle sue speranze di poter lavorare come sceneggiatrice. Eppure, il tentativo non fu vano e la

lettura di queste tre brevi opere potrà meglio farci comprendere quanto l'amore per il cinema abbia influenzato lo stile indimenticabile dell'autrice di Suite francese.

All'inizio dei disordini russi nel 1917 era a San Pietroburgo, nel cuore pulsante della Storia. La sua famiglia decise subito di spostarsi in Finlandia, ma dopo un anno l'onda del mutamento la raggiungesse di nuovo: nel 1918 scoppiò la guerra civile finlandese. Queste esperienze sono raccolte in un testo composto da tre scritti: *Nascita di una rivoluzione*, nel quale la scrittrice fissa il ricordo autentico del febbraio sovietico; *La magia*, resoconto dei giorni finlandesi; *Emilie Plater*, breve storia della patriota polacca che prese parte alla Rivolta di Novembre (1830-1831) contro l'Impero russo. La Némirovsky vede il bel viso fiero di una rivoluzione pacifica tramutarsi improvvisamente in un volto sfigurato e folle cosperso di sangue. Sono ricordi che non mi hanno mai abbandonata, ma che sono così brutali, così particolari, così vivi che sarebbe un peccato dissimularli con affabulazioni di ogni tipo. Sono immagini viste con gli occhi di una bambina, con gli occhi di un intero popolo e con quelli di un'eroina che muore combattendo per il suo Paese. irene nemirovsky ebook: *La nemica* Irène Némirovsky, 2013-03-06T00:00:00+01:00 Nel luglio del 1928 sulla rivista letteraria *Les Oeuvres libres* dell'editore Fayard apparve un romanzo breve a firma Pierre Nérey. Si trattava di *L'Ennemie* (La Nemica) che una giovane e ancora sconosciuta Irène Némirovsky (il successo sarebbe arrivato solo l'anno dopo con *David Golder*) pubblicò con lo pseudonimo ottenuto dall'anagramma del suo nome (Nérey/Irene), rivelando così il carattere profondamente autobiografico dell'opera: il ritratto di una madre egoista e infedele che viene atrocemente punita dalla figlia, la quale prima le porta via l'amante e poi decide di togliersi la vita. Impossibile non ritrovare nel ritratto impietoso della donna le caratteristiche della madre dell'autrice, che era solita parlare di lei come "la nemica", e con la quale ebbe un rapporto estremamente conflittuale. L'odio e l'orgoglio la fanno da padroni in questo romanzo di formazione: odio "selvaggio e irrazionale" di una ragazza nei confronti di una madre egoista e criminale; orgoglio "oscuro e intenso" che impedisce una visione chiara e oggettiva delle cose. La stessa Némirovsky confidò nel suo diario il "dolore" e la "febbre" e, soprattutto, la sua perplessità nel ripercorrere certi snodi della mente in un romanzo "necessario" che si riassume nell'"incontrollabile desiderio" della sua protagonista, Gabry, di gettare in viso a sua madre l'accusa "Io so, io ho visto!". La nemica si configura così, in un certo modo, come una misteriosa, dolorosa revanche, connotata dalle stigmate della sofferenza, dell'odio, del peccato, dell'orgoglio e del rimorso, teatro di sentimenti contraddittori il cui groviglio potrà sciogliersi e trovare la propria catarsi soltanto nella drammaticità del finale.
