MARKET COMPARABLES OFFER A RELATIVE VALUATION PERSPECTIVE AND ARE OFTEN USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH OTHER METHODS.

ASSET-BASED VALUATION

ASSET-BASED VALUATION CALCULATES VALUE BY SUMMING THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF A COMPANY'S TANGIBLE AND INTANGIBLE ASSETS, MINUS LIABILITIES. THIS METHOD IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR ASSET-INTENSIVE BUSINESSES OR LIQUIDATION SCENARIOS.

OPTION PRICING MODELS

OPTION PRICING MODELS, SUCH AS THE BLACK-SCHOLES MODEL, ARE APPLIED TO VALUE FINANCIAL DERIVATIVES AND COMPANIES WITH SIGNIFICANT GROWTH OPTIONS OR CONTINGENT CLAIMS. THESE MODELS REQUIRE ADVANCED MATHEMATICAL UNDERSTANDING AND ARE COVERED IN SPECIALIZED VALUATION BOOKS.
