What Is HIV and How Does It Affect the Body?

HIV, or Human Immunodeficiency Virus, is a virus that attacks the immune system, specifically targeting CD4 cells (T cells), which play a crucial role in defending the body against infections. Mother-to-Child Transmission

HIV can be passed from mother to child during pregnancy, childbirth, or breastfeeding. The risk can be significantly reduced with proper medical care, including antiretroviral therapy for the mother and safe delivery practices.

Other Potential but Rare Routes

Although extremely rare, HIV transmission can occur through deep open-mouth kissing if both partners have sores or bleeding gums and there is blood exchange. The virus cannot survive outside the body for long, making casual

contact, such as hugging, shaking hands, or sharing dishes, non-infectious.

Factors Influencing HIV Transmission Risk

Viral Load

An individual's viral load (the amount of HIV in the blood) greatly impacts their risk of transmitting the virus. People with high viral loads are more likely to transmit HIV, while those on effective antiretroviral therapy (ART) who have an undetectable viral load are much less likely to pass on the virus.

Second, the narrow focus on population growth (the population bomb) which had been a neo-Malthusian concern and preoccupation ever since the Club of Rome published its 1972 report *Limits to Growth*, was replaced by the comprehensive concept of (sexual and) reproductive health. Third, and linked to the definition and introduction of the reproductive health concept, was the strong call for a paradigm shift away from a policy environment driven by demographic considerations (sometimes to the point of using coercion in family planning services in order to reach demographic targets) to an environment that recognized the right of individuals to make their own choices. And, last but not least, ICPD as well as the Fourth World Conference on Women (FWCW) held the following year in Beijing, People's Republic of China, strongly emphasized that the
