Attach the bowl piece to the end of the downstem, ensuring a snug fit. If using aluminum foil, shape it into a small bowl and poke several holes in the bottom.

Test for air leaks by covering the carb and inhaling through the bottle's mouthpiece. If air escapes, reinforce seals with additional
